Here's a simple checklist you can use to drastically reduce your property's risk.

	Clean and maintain gutters and roofs.	Remove weeds and cut grass to 10 centimetres or less.
	Relocate propane, firewood and other fuel sources 10 to 30 metres away from structures.	Prune trees to create a two-metre clearance from the ground to the lowest branches.
м	Plant wildfire-resistant vegetation to reduce potential fuels on your property.	Clean under your deck to remove any combustible material. Establish a 1.5-metre non-combustible zone around the perimeter of the house and deck.
